

Vision and Goals: WHAT

- Vision
 - Future-oriented statement of what should be
- Goal
 - Aligned with stage of HV coordination
 - SMART- specific, measurable,
 achievable, relevant, time bound




Vision and Goals: WHY

Vision

- Guide decision making
- Inspire
- Give sense of purpose

Goals

- Make progress in achieving vision
- Advance along coordination continuum





Vision and Goals: WHO

- Stakeholders focused on coordination
 - Family serving organizations
 - Direct service providers
 - Families
 - Funders
 - Others

Vision and Goals: HOW

- Conduct listening sessions
- Facilitate visioning exercises
- Conduct focus groups and interviews with key leaders
- Ask key questions
 - O What does success look like?
 - o How can we achieve success?

Environmental Scan: WHAT

- Systematic process of data collection, analysis, and interpretation to inform a comprehensive picture of services, programs, and resources available to support children and families
- Identification of community assets as well as gaps in programming, duplication of services, and challenges related to access and quality



Environmental Scan: WHY & WHO

- Identify community partners who provide critical services to support children and families
- Identify and prioritize families who would benefit from home visiting
- HVC lead agency convenes stakeholders and builds partnerships

Environmental Scan: HOW

- Identify all relevant stakeholders
- Gather and review data
- Identify community assets and gaps
- Assess alignment between family needs and available services
- Disseminate findings
- Inform vision and SMART goals

Vision and Goals: Assessing Progress

- To what degree do family-serving organizations in your county have:
 - A defined and shared vision for coordination of early childhood and family services?
 - SMART goals for cross-sector collaboration
- Does your county have a written plan for aligning HV services with other county resources and needs?

San Bernardino County Home Visiting System Coordination







Home Visiting System (HVS) framework



The ultimate goal of the framework is to create an "efficient, coordinated and sustainable local home visiting system" that serves more families, increases interconnected local early childhood systems, and builds networks of cross-county coordination and collaboration.

Project Teams



Provides funding to help counties coordinate implementation of evidence-based home visiting programs

HVS Stakeholder Committee

- Initial outreach from El Sol in October 2020
- Engagement since November on a monthly basis



Environmental scan

 Consider how social determinants of health impact families' ability to access and benefit from HV services





- We organized indicators by home visiting outcome domains as specified in the MIECHV legislation
 - (e.g., maternal health, child development and school readiness)
- We chose key indicators for each domain based on stakeholder input
- We identified disparities across race and ethnicity

Maternal Health

Indicator	California	San Bernardino	By region?
Substance use (per 1,000 hospitalizations of pregnant females, 15 – 44) ¹	21	26.8	
Prenatal depressive symptoms ²	14.1%	15.3%	

Rates of prenatal depression in the county are similar to the state average. Substance use rates among pregnant women are higher, particularly for Black and white women, but much lower for Asian women



Goals for Today

First 5 Humboldt & California Center for Rural Policy (CCRP)

- First 5 Humboldt contracted with CCRP to conduct the environmental scan and facilitate three convenings
- We met with First 5 Humboldt prior to each convening to discuss the agenda and goals
- We participated in collaborative learning opportunities with other rural California counties
- We co-created materials with First 5 Humboldt and members of the workgroup





Defining Partners, Purpose & Scope

- Step 1: Work with First 5 Humboldt to identify the partners working in this space
- Step 2: Engage partners and ask them "who are we missing?"
- Step 3: Be clear about what we were asking partners to do
- Step 4: Engage with the expertise of partners through broad, open-ended questions



Environmental Scan-Methods



- Reviewed publicly available secondary data- asked partners to tell us what data sources they
 used or were aware of
- Conducted one-on-one, program-specific interviews
- Conducted a program characteristics survey to supplement interviews
- Utilized input and ideas generated during the workgroup meetings

Engaging the Workgroup

- Use of collaborative google slide decks that were co-created during the meetings and sent out to partners afterwards
- Facilitate information sharing through a variety of methods: chat, unmute and share, write directly onto sticky notes
- One-on-one interviews to gather program-specific information for the scan, convenings to think as a group about how we want to see efforts coordinated, aligned and expanded



Building a Shared Vision & Goals



- We asked a lot of questions during the convenings and built on responses from participants to create the next set of questions
- We did a lot of listening to understand what was important to partners
- We looked at what partners were already doing well
- We looked at areas that multiple partners identified as opportunities for growth/expansion

Lessons Learned



- Be clear about the time commitment you are asking for from partners
- Ask questions and document partners' input
- We are happy to share our materials for you to adapt for your project

Materials include: Google slide decks, questions asked during convenings, one-on-one interview questions, program characteristics survey, report (in draft form now but will be finalized by 6/30)
