Strategies to Build Parent Leadership

Short-Term Strategies

Method	Why Use This Method?	Keep in Mind
Survey Paper, text, email, mail, in-person	 Large sample size Low cost Cover many questions Anonymity & confidentiality 	 Survey construction Response rate Limited clarification (not able to follow-up with respondent)
Focus Group or Listening Session In-person Usually 6-10 people About 1-2 hours, 5-6 questions	 Diverse views on a topic More detailed info in shorter amount of time Build ideas Stories and quotes 	 Trained moderator & notetaker Cost Group composition Record & selectively transcribe
Interview 1 person	 Very in-depth feedback Allows for follow-up questions Stories and quotes 	 Skilled interviewer Recruiting difficulties Record & transcribe

Long-Term Strategies

Method	Why Use This Method?	Keep in Mind
 Parent Network Many parents In-person or virtual setting Regular frequency May be parent-led, staff-led, or combination 	 Provides strong relationship-building and positive support for parents from their peers Offers a good starting point for parents who are interested in building leadership skills and getting more involved behind the scenes Helps program staff identify parents who may be a good fit for other leadership opportunities 	 The role of staff Opportunity to partner with a parent organization Structure and format Single or multiple networks
 Advisory Council 5-10 caregivers In-person or virtual setting Regular frequency May stand-alone or be embedded in a larger coalition, committee, or workgroup 	 Offers parents options to get involved in specific initiatives based on their strengths or interests Parents provide in-depth feedback to help design, implement, and evaluate the program 	 Duration of commitment Collaboration with other departments or organizations Influence on decision-making
 Parent Partners 1-3 parents In-person or virtual Regular frequency May join staff meetings or provide consultation 1-1 	 Develops strong, trusting relationships between staff and parent partners based on mutual respect Parents are valued members of the program team Parents co-create program goals, strategies, and tactics to address family needs 	 Duration of commitment Training and comfort level Staff readiness Reaching consensus
