

# WHO WE ARE

Latin American Youth Center's (LAYC) Promotor Pathway<sup>®</sup> is a long-term client management intervention model for cultivating a trusting relationship with youth to support success in education,

employment, and healthy behaviors. Culturally competent practices

Culturally competent p are embedded in the model, its tools, and the recruitment and training of experienced youth workers called Promotores.

## WHAT WE DO

Promotores work one-on-one with youth for an average of 2 to 4 years to provide—

#### Intensive individualized case management:

Promotores assess each youth's needs and strengths, make intentional connections to resources, and help them identify goals and work toward reaching them.

**Mentoring:** Promotores provide guidance and model prosocial behaviors. By maintaining a stable, caring relationship, Promotores help reestablish a connection between the youth, their school, and their community.

**Advocacy:** Promotores advocate for youth with school staff, social services, family members, and others to ensure youth receive necessary services and build self-advocacy skills.

**Crisis Intervention:** Promotores are available to youth 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

### **OUTCOMES**

The Promotor Pathway<sup>®</sup> has served over 1,400 youth since 2008.

A multiyear randomized control trial comparing outcomes among Promotor Pathway participants to youth who did not participate, found that Promotor Pathway youth were—

PROMOTORES



**33%** more likely to be engaged in school

**60%** less likely to have slept in a shelter or on the streets

A follow-up study 5 years later found Promotor Pathway youth were-

More likely to earn a high school diploma or GED with

81% earning a high school diploma or GED compared to

75% youth in the control group\*

**Earning about \$7,700 more** per year than youth in the control group

\*control group = youth who did not have a Promotor.

LAYC's Promotor Pathway<sup>®</sup> is an evidence-based program. Being evidence-based means that they have tested the effectiveness of their services in several rigorous evaluation studies. They also have critical evaluation building blocks in place.

- Experience with rigorous external evaluation and follow-up longitudinal evaluation
- A fully articulated logic model that shows the pathways between services and expected outcomes
